TRAFFIC TOLL DOWN IN JULY

CHICAGO, Aug. 29-(INS)-For the first time in nine consecutive months, the nation's traffic death toll was lower last month than in July of 1939, the National Safety Council reported today. The preceding nine months, the death tolls were higher than for the corresponding months of a year earlier.

The 1940 July death toll was 2,760, compared with 2,850 highway deaths for the month in 1939. This brought to 17,420 the total 1940 deaths up to the end of July, representing a 5 per cent increase over last year.

The buliding once the only community owned postoffice in the world, now houses the postoffice, community public library, city light and water works office, city auditor's office, and the service director's office. Popular subscriptions by the citizens paid for the construction of the building and the rental received from the postoffice and two office rooms paid for the maintenance of the park up until the time the city took over the Community Welfare-assn's property.
