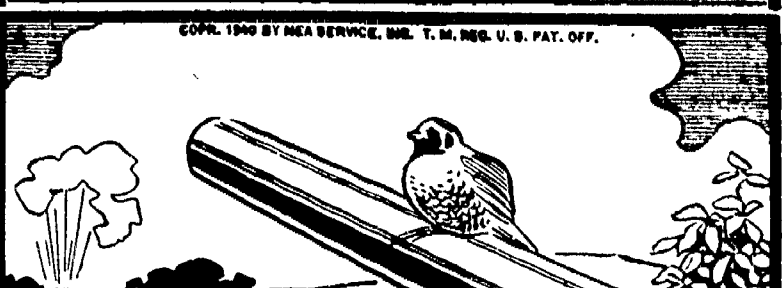

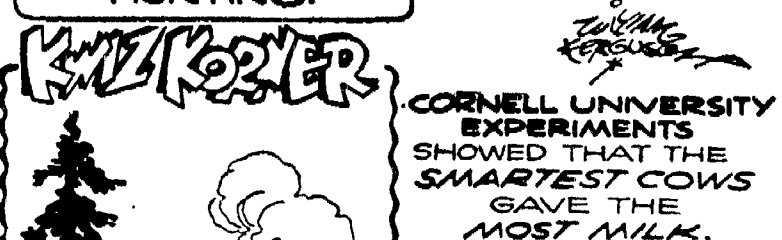

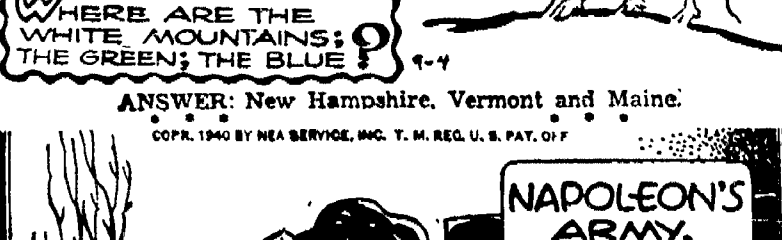

MANY SPECIES OF WILDLIFE ACTUALLY INCREASE IN WAR ZONES, DUE TO CESSATION OF HUNTING.



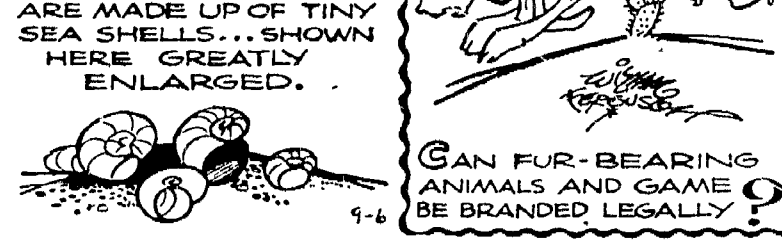

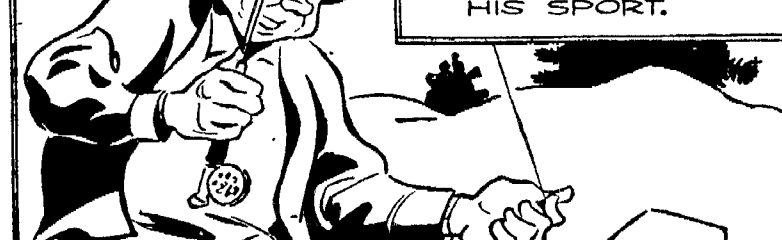

# Quilna Offers Comedy Hit; Starts Thursday; No Preview

### Trio Starred In Feature At State; Three Play In Double Bill At Lyric; Flynn Heads Ohio Hit

Changing the regular preview night policy for this week, the Quilna management announced today that the new comedy hit, "He Stayed for Breakfast," starring Melvyn Douglas and Loretta Young, will commence Thursday. The current hits, "Girl from Avenue A," and "Charlie Chan in Panama," will be shown for the last times Wednesday.

At the State theatre Ann Sheridan, Humphrey Bogart and Jeffrey Lynn are the stars of the Thursday attraction, "It All Came True," co-featured with the amazing "Dr. Cyclops." Showing for the last times Wednesday are "My Favorite Wife," a comedy starring Cary Grant, Irene Dunne, Randolph Scott and Gail Patrick, and "French Without Tears."

At the Lyric theatre the features, "In Old Chicago," and "Alexanders Ragtime Band," feature the same trio of stars in both pictures—Alice Faye, Tyrone Power and Don Ameche. Both pictures in early runs were accorded tremendous reception by theatre patrons and offer one opportunity to see two of the biggest hits of the past year.

Errol Flynn is starred in the Ohio feature, "The Sea Hawk," the story of a daring buccaner of the days when England was laying the foundation for her later tremendous sea power. Others in the cast of the romantic and adventurous film are Branda Marshall, Alan Hale, Claude Rains, Donald Crisp, Flora Robson, Una O'Connor and Gilbert Roland.

At the Rialto a fine double-horror show is offered in "The Return of the Frog" and "The Demon Barber of Fleet Street." Fox Film-goers who like to shiver, shake, and shudder at demonic doings on the screen, this pair of perturbers will fill the bill.

"It's bandits and a thrilling race between two rival stagecoach owners that brings Roy Boyd back to Lima in "Stagecoach War," with his inseparable partner, "Lucky." A story based on an actual case which came to the attention of the FBI is moulded into screen entertainment in the co-feature, "Queen of the Mob."

Just think of it... a double horror-show... over two hours of sheer terror... that's what's in store for film-goers at the Rialto theatre when "The Return of the Frog" and "The Demon Barber of Fleet Street" are now showing.

Edgar Wallace, the creator of some of the best detective and mystery stories ever written, is responsible for "The Return of the Frog," which has been translated to the screen by Ian Hay from the Wallace best-seller, "The India Rubber Man" Gordon Harker, who has won a high place for himself in the ranks of screen sleuths, is seen characterizing Wallace's famous detective, Inspector Elk of Scotland Yard. stars are Loretta Young, who reached the very forefront of Hollywood comedienne ranks with her performance in "The Doctor Takes a Wife," and Melvyn Douglas, whose abilities as a sophisticated comedian are too well known to expand upon.

"He Stayed for Breakfast" was directed by Alexander Hall, successful maker of such hits as "The Doctor Takes a Wife," "The Amazing Mr. Williams," "Little Miss Marker" and "There's Always a Woman."

Douglas is seen in the new film as a politically-conscious waiter, who deftly takes a potshot at a fugitive, he hides in the apartment of the banker's estranged wife, Miss Young, and she contrives to conceal him not only from the police but from her former husband, eventually falling in love with him herself and eventually, too, taking a potshot at the banker herself! Eugene Pallette is the unfortunate target; Alan Marshall and Una O'Connor are the other important members of the cast.

Good, fast action, culminating in a thrilling race between two stagecoaches, characterizes the latest adventure of the famous cinema cowboy "Hopalong" Cassidy called "Stagecoach War," which is now at the Sigma theatre.

With William Boyd again in the role of Cassidy, the character created by Clarence E. Mulford, and who has been hero to Western fans both cinematic and literary for more than thirty years, the cast of "Stagecoach War" includes such well-known figures as Russell Hayden, Britt Wood and The

# SIX PERSONS ARE TREATED FOR INJURIES

King's Men of radio fame, and Harvey Stephens, J. Farrell MacDonald, Julie Carter, and many others, including the usual quota of hard riding cowboys culled from nearby ranches by Producer Harry Sherman.

As implied by the title, the plot of "Stagecoach War" concerns itself with a race between two rival factions to win a highly coveted contract to carry the mails between two frontier towns. It is also a test between Mustangs and Morgan horses to furnish the traction power. Dirty work enters when it is discovered that one of the contending parties is in cahoots with a band of highwaymen who have made it a practice to hold up the stage, and it becomes Cassidy's task to clean this band.

"Stagecoach War" depicts some of the usual outdoor action romance in that there is hardly a villain in the piece and it contains a surprise ending. There is also some splendid Western music, supplied by The King's Men, that important adjunct to the Fibber McGee and Molly radio program.

High on the bridge of an antique, rocking, wooden warship, Errol Flynn stands to direct the English attack on the Spanish galleon. Cannon roar, blasting great holes in the sides of each ship, men clamber up the rigging, prepared to board the opposing vessel, knives held in their teeth, pistols in their belts, blood on their faces and half-naked bodies.

The sails bulged and the ships careered dangerously as they slid together. Flynn, Alan Hale, Gilbert Roland, Claude Rains, J. M. Kerrigan and a dozen other well known actors, leap into action at the same moment. Swords clash, men tumble between the grinding ships, ropes and spurs fall from the rigging where hand to hand battles are waged. On a parallel high above the whole melee, Director Michael Curtiz stands to direct the fight, one of the most spectacular of all the violent action scenes of "The Sea Hawk," which is now at the Ohio.

Audiences will see the athletic Mr. Flynn and the powerful Alan Hale and all the others, battle to apparent defeat or triumph on these huge rocking sailing ships. The cheers of the small boys and the admiration of the men and women who like action will give to these principals. But they also, if unknowingly, paying tribute to hundreds of studio workers.
