

# Alec Templeton To Begin New Program Series Friday

### Al Pearce Will Present 26-Year-Old Blind Tenor; Ameche To Play In Dramatic Presentation

Alec Templeton, the witty improviser, parodist and mimic of the piano, will bring his sparkling musical program back to the airwaves Friday when he begins his new 1940-41 series of "Alec Templeton Time" programs to be heard each Friday at 6:30 p. m. over WEAF.

Templeton acquired a wide reputation in his native England and on the continent prior to coming to the United States in 1935 as a featured entertainer with Jack Hylton's orchestra.

The popular and recently married pianist again will have with him on his programs Ray Noble's orchestra and Pat O'Malley, the Lancashire lad whose songs and stories were a hit on the Templeton program last winter.

Edmund Denney, 26-year-old blind tenor who is regularly featured on Topeka's WIBW, will be the next talented newcomer to the networks to be presented by Al Pearce. Denney will sing on the Peace program Friday at 6:30 p. m. on WABC.

Denney started his radio career seven years ago after winning an amateur contest in a small Nebraska town, and has been featured for the past six years on WIBW, where he is one of the station's most popular entertainers. He has the largest repertoire of that station's staff, most of the numbers committed to memory. He reads new songs from Braille as he sings. Interesting to note is that his blindness has never been mentioned on the air, for it has never been necessary to appeal to the sympathies of his audience to win popularity. His young wife will accompany him on the trip to Hollywood.

Don Ameche will play the role of a fugitive from justice mistaken for a fond mother's long lost son during the Don Ameche show, Friday from 9 to 9:30 p. m. over WEAF.

Ameche will be starred in "The Son of Mama Posito," written by Max Aley and adapted for radio by Roger Grayson. Claire Trevor will play the part of Mama Posito's daughter, who knows that her brother is dead and realizes that the "returned son" is an im-

poster. In the musical portion of the show, western songs by Ameche and Pat Friday will be featured. Postponed on Aug. 13 because of inclement weather, light heavyweight champion Billy Conn's heavyweight venture against Bob Pastor, to be staged at Madison Square Garden on Friday will be described over WJZ by Sam Taub and Bill Stern beginning at 9 p. m.

## CANDY FACTORY OPENS SEPT. 16

### Modern Structure At Kenton Replaces One Destroyed By Fire

(Lima News Bureau)  
KENTON, Sept. 6.—The opening date of the newly-rebuilt Runkle Co. plant here has been set at Sept. 16 or shortly thereafter, William J. Malone, secretary and treasurer of the corporation, said today. Work on preparing the plant for manufacturing activities is being rushed so that candy can be made in time for the Christmas season.

A large part of the building was razed by fire last Nov. 5 but has been reconstructed into a one-story modern building. Much of the machinery for making candy has been installed and any delay will be caused by minor parts which have not yet been received, Malone said.

About 75 experienced candy workers will be employed at first and more will be added as manufacturing picks up. Nick Fiorella of Chicago, candy-making expert, has been employed as plant superintendent and George F. Murphy of New York has taken over the duties of sales manager. Walter Johnson Jr. will have entire charge of the manufacturing of the business while Malone will supervise sales and do other executive work. The office force has been moved into the new office space in the structure John Hogan, for many years with the company, will have charge of the office personnel and work.

The building has been constructed on a streamlined manufacturing basis with all raw materials passing thru one main room. Materials are purchased in carload lots and stored in the basement beneath the main room. The candy passes from that room to other parts of the factory, always toward the shipping room as it goes thru the various stages of manufacturing and packing. The bake shop, in which fig bars and other cakes and cookies are made, is located in the other side of the building but near the shipping room.

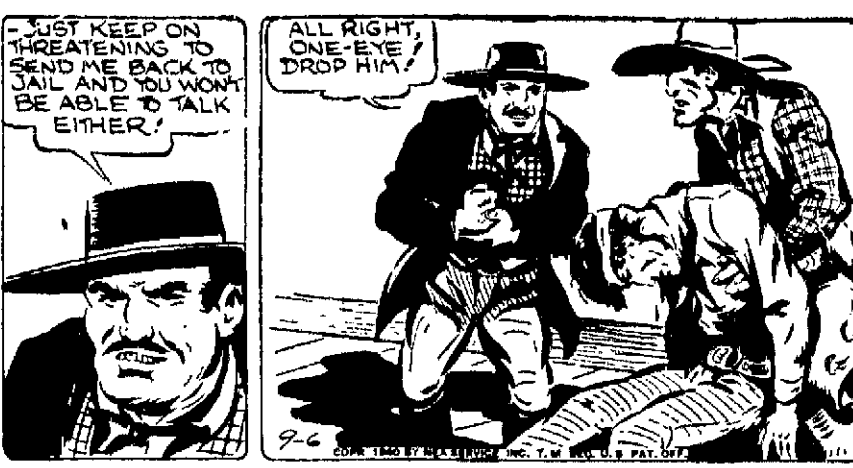

## QUARANTINE IS PLACED ON DOGS IN SHELBY-CO

SIDNEY, Sept. 6.—Effective Thursday, Sidney and Shelby-co were under strict dog quarantine. This decision was made by Dr. Harry Wain, county health commissioner, and followed the finding of another case of rabies in a pet dog at Anna. The dog started acting strangely during the latter part of last week and was placed under observation in quarantine.

Following its death Labor Day, the head was examined by the state department of health and it was found to have been suffering with rabies.

Parts of Shelby-co have been under quarantine since late summer when a case of rabies was found and it was known the dog had been seen in various neighborhoods and had fought with dogs in other parts of the county north of Sidney.
