"Foreign Correspondent" Thriller Is Due For First Airing; Zany Stars Plan Special Offering

It will be double feature night at Kay Kyser's College of Musical Knowledge Wednesday at 9 p. m. over WEAF.

BELLEFONTAINE, Sept. 18.—(NS)—Three-year-old Sandra Jean Thrush drowned when she fell into a foot of water while playing in front of her summer home on Semmool island, Indian Lake. Logan-co officials reported today.

The victim was the daughter of M. C. Thrush, superintendent of schools at nearby Lewistown. Bellefontaine firemen attempted resuscitation with an inhalator but their efforts failed. Two brothers besides the parents survive.

HANCOCK GETS \$9,798 IN PARITY PAYMENTS

FINDLAY, Sept. 18.—Three hundred and fifty checks totaling \$9,798.52 have been received here for distribution to farmers in Hancock-co for corn and wheat parity payments. R. M. Traucht, county AAA chairman reported today. The checks are the third group to be received here. About 40 per cent of the checks have been received.

Traucht said that a total of 224 wheat loans have been made so far on 75,822 bushels for a total amount of \$61,623.45. The deadline for filing for the loans is Dec. 31.

DRAFTEES WILL NOT BE "PUSHED" FOR PAYMENTS FOR HOME MORTGAGES

CLEVELAND, Sept. 18.—(AP)—Ohioans called for military training under the national defense program won't be "pushed" for home mortgage payments while in camp under a program announced by the executive committee of the Ohio Savings and Loan league.

The league today opened its 52nd annual state convention which continues thru Friday.

"We wish to take care of young home owners called into service," said E. J. Rupert, state president. "Detailed plans to do this will be worked into a uniform policy for the state."

Don L. Tobin of Columbus, executive vice president, termed the policy a "sympathetic move to honor the uniform."

"The league can't postpone payment dates indefinitely, but sav-

ings and loan institutions in the state won't push National Guardsmen and others called into service," Tobin said.

In an opening session address, Rupert told delegates Ohio savings and loan companies hoped to finance any housing construction in the state in connection with expansion of industrial activities under the defense program. The federal government already has planned to make loans for such building.

"Ohio is in the midst of a constant business upswing," Rupert also said. "Our industry foresees an increasing payroll in nearly all industry, but does not expect it to reach its peak until next spring."

He reported the state's loan demand continues 22 per cent above last year, but cash still is piling up in Ohio's 700 savings and loan institutions.
