WASHINGTON, Sept. 19-(UP) John W. Davis, Democratic presidential nominee in 1924 who became a founder of the American Liberty League 10 years later, today denounced a third term for any president, asserting that "the man has not yet been born of woman" whom he would entrust with the presidency for more than eight years.

Davis urged that congress set now "a definite, fixed, certain termination to the length of any man's occupancy of the presidency," and suggested that if the only one man is fit for the position we may as well "install a perunder any name we choose to give

He revealed his opposition to a hird term before hearings of a enate judiciary subcommittee vhich is considering a proposal to limit the President to one, six-year term. Davis did not mention President Roosevelt by name or the current third term campaign.




