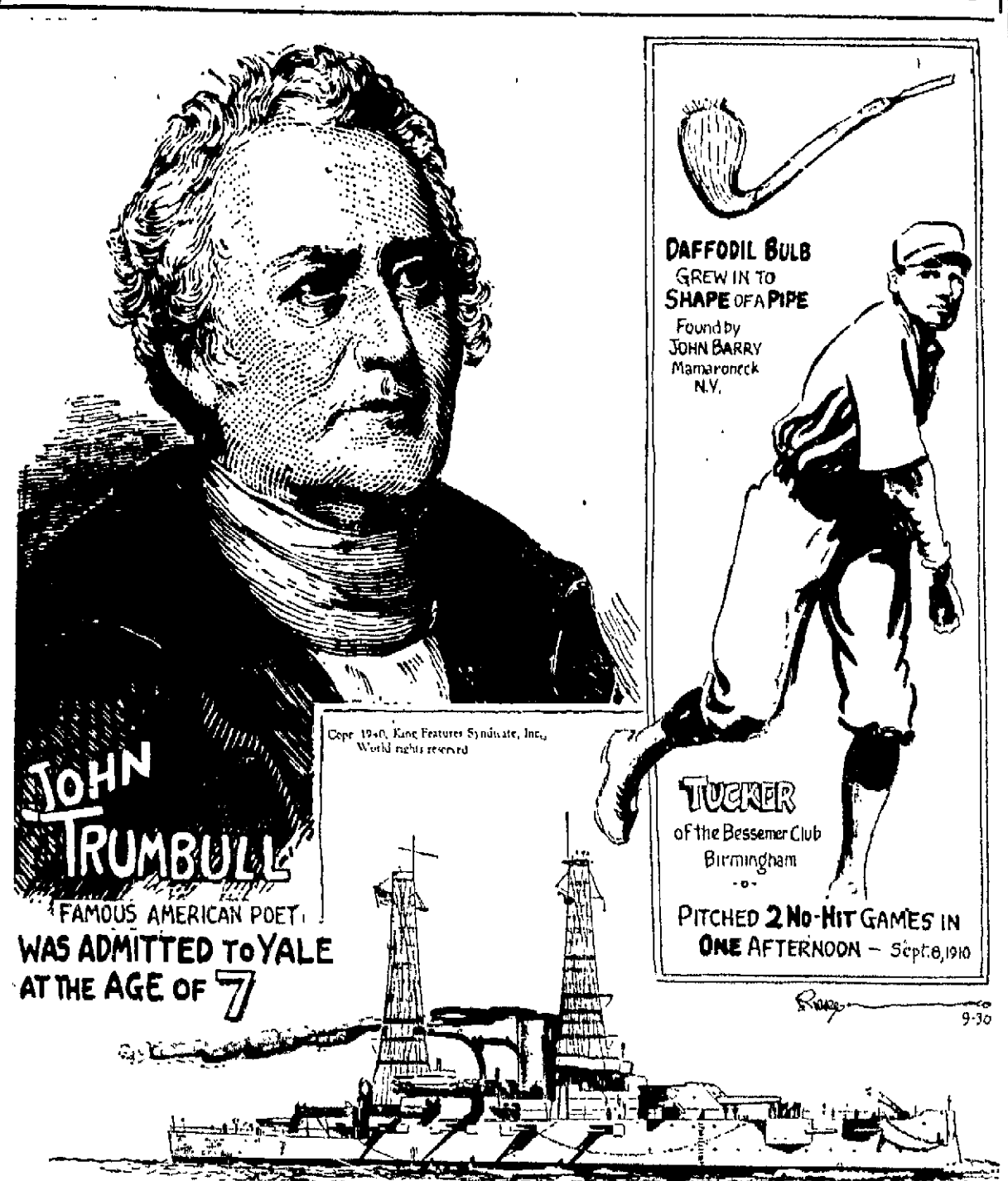

24 MILES OF ROADS IN PUTNAM-CO IMPROVED UNDER \$15,381 PROGRAM

PUTNAM, Sept. 30—Extensive improvement of township roads in Putnam-co is in progress with a total of 24 miles of thoroughfares scheduled to be surface treated before the program is completed at an estimated expenditure of \$15,381.56.

At the same time, it was learned today that the county is preparing to resurface at least three roads in its system which were not included in the spring and summer repair program.

The township program follows: The township line road between Union, Pleasant, Greensburg and Ottawa-tps. Four and three-quarters miles from U. S. Route 224 to the Kalida-Columbus Grove-rd to be surface treated with asphalt at a total cost of \$2,890.89.
