ISLE NOW RICH SOLD FOR SONG

Site Of Million Dollar Plant Once Purchased For Flintlock Rifle

CHARLESTON, W. Va., Oct. 4.—(UP)—Peter Stuyvesant, the crafty Dutchman who traded \$24 worth of trinkets for Manhattan Island, had nothing on Charles Blaine, an early settler of the rich Kanawha valley.

According to local historians, Blaine bought with a \$24 flintlock rifle the island which today is the site of chemical operations worth several millions of dollars.

The only difference was that while Stuyvesant negotiated with a tribe, Blaine made his trade with Fleming Cobb, an Indian fighter whose name is linked with most of southern West Virginia's 18th century history.

Today the island, named for Blaine, is much larger due to fills made by the corporation whose plant—an important cog in the nation's defense program—occupies it.

The pages of Kanawha valley history describe Cobb as one of the section's outstanding characters and eminent citizens. He once saved Charleston by bringing needed ammunition from Fort Randolph, now Point Pleasant, to defend the city from a threatened Indian attack.
