Honeymoon," filmization of Dorothy L. Sayers' entertaining narrative of a pair of honeymooners, both previously associated with the business of crime, who go to the English countryside to "get away from it all" only to discover themselves in possession of the corpse of a murdered man. With Robert Montgomery as Lord Peter Wimsey, debonair amateur detective, and Constance Cummings as his mystery fiction-writer wife, filling the leads, the action runs along at a merry pace with any number of suspects seeming to fit the picture as the guilty men, and an innocent-looking unwarranted plant forming a pivotal clue in the final solving of the crime. Montgomery shifts with agility from his neurotic gangster-nobleman of "The Earl of Chicago" to the suave top-hat-and-tails crime detector of his present vehicle. Combining a sense of comedy with the technical brilliance for which he has long been noted, he brings Lord Peter Wimsey to the screen with a freshness and vitality that makes his every entry into a scene a welcome event. Sterling support is given the star in the performance of Constance Cummings as the bride who longs for a conventional honeymoon but soon finds that she must match her wits to that of her husband if she is to get the peace and quiet for which she hopes. Others in an excellent cast include Sir Seymour Hicks, Leslie Banks and Robert Newton.
