Income amounted to \$501 for each man, woman and child-7 per cent below the national per capita average of \$536. Wisconsin ranked 20th among all states in 1939 per capita income. A recently completed 11-year

study, Jones reported, showed Wisconsin per capita income declined \$653 in 1929, the peak prosperity year, to \$338 in 1933, while a general improvement oc-curred from 1933 through 1939. Last year the state, with 2.38 of the nation's population, had 2.22 per cent of total income, and in the 11-year period Wisconsin

per capita income was lower than

Wisconsin incomes in 1939 Jones said, included \$955,000,000 in wages or salaries, representing 67 per cent of the total; \$113,000.
