

Water Witch **Just Scientist** at Heart

HOLLOW SPRINGS, Tenn.— (U.P.)—Give F. E. DeLong a twopronged twig from a peachtree or hazel shrub and he says he'll find water.

DeLong, who lives within three miles of the community known as Hoo-Doo, has been "water witching" for 50 years, and he says that if all the wells he has found were lined up they would reach from here to California.

DeLong will take a 3-foot forked wand in hand, hold the crotch upward and start walking. When the crotch of the limb turns down, he declares water will be found at that point. "T've never failed," he said,
