Observance Of Knute Rockne Week Proclaimed By Mayor

Knute Rockne Week in Lima has been set for Oct. 26-Nov. 1 by proclamation of Mayor Frank E. McClain.

The observance will be marked by public tributes to Rockne, dedication of the weekly high school grid battle to his memory and other activities.

The Lima demonstration also will be featured by the showing of an outstanding motion picture at Warner's Ohio theatre, "Knute Rockne - All American," a tribute to sportsmanship in American football history.

In proclaiming the special week, Mayor McClain said "the life of Knute Rockne should be an inspiration to every American boy."

Formal dedication of the Central-Van Wert high school game Friday night was announced by Central school officials. A special Rockne program will be presented between halves with Central's snappy band providing a series of new formations specially worked out for the occasion.

South high's band will parade Saturday afternoon in connection with the Rockne demonstration. TWO HELD FOR FEDERAL MEN IN COIN PROBE

Two transients who reportedly offered bogus money in exchange for groceries at four Lima stores Tuesday are in city jail awaiting disposition of their case by federal authorities.

They were listed on the police blotter as John Stiller, 64, no home, and James Hambl, 39, of Lansing, Mich.

Police said the men were arrested in the 600 block of N. Jameson-av by Detective Al Mills after he had been notified by cruiser radio that Stiller had purchased a pound of coffee and a can of milk at the Kelley grocery, 1101 W. North-st, with counterfeit money.

At police headquarters, Stiller signed a confession, officials said, in which he admitted casting a number of dimes from rabbit metal in a plaster of paris mold. He allegedly said he and Hambl had bought merchandise from two bakeries and two grocery stores.

The men told police they had been in Lima several days and that they had been staying in a "hobo jungle" along the Pennsylvania railroad tracks west of Lima.
