# 17-DAY NAP IS LAST SLEEP WOMAN ENJOYS FOR PAST THREE YEARS

UPPER SANDUSKY, Oct. 25.—(AP) — No kin of Rip Van Winkle is pretty Ninabelle Cross, who awoke from a 17-day stupor three and one-half years ago and hasn't closed her eyes in sleep since.

Far from missing her night-ly rest, this 33-year-old victim of a rare affliction just doesn't become sleepy—doesn't even yawn. The present malady is one of a series of sabbal illnesses which have plagued the former school teacher and musician for 12 years.

She was graduated from Bowling Green university and had taught for a year in Port Clinton public schools when she suffered an attack of influenza. This was followed by acute encephalitis, a form of sleeping sickness, which later was supplanted by a suppurative encephalitis with a meningitis sequel.

To top things off, Miss Cross hicoughed continually for 42 days, stopped for eight, then hicoughed for nine more until she coughed up a wire staple. She later suffered a neck injury which brought on a complete paralysis of her right arm and leg, and was apparently headed for recovery when she fell and injured her back.

Altho too weak to take full advantage of her 24 daily hours of

wakefulness, Miss Cross has a variety of activities to break the nocturnal monotony. Reading, needlework and correspondence fill in hours when she is not listening to her bedside radio—a gift from former fellow teachers. Required to conserve her strength, Miss Cross has trained her mind and body to relax altho actual sleep is impossible. Snapping eyes and a vivacious smile mirror her steadfastly cheerful outlook upon life and her firm conviction that she will recover fully. She hopes to return to both teaching and music.

The daughter of a cemetery caretaker, Miss Cross resides with her parents on cemetery grounds south of here.
