Since June, 1925, when he accidentally swallowed a lye and ammonia compound which burned the lining of his throat and stomach, Koehnath has lived on liquids fed thru a tube. Mostly milk, raw eggs, and soups.

He smokes a pipe, however, and uses a strong tobacco. "I enjoy the smell," he says.

Comunal bliss is just that as far as they are concerned until Dick, who works at being a young, underpaid lawyer, finds that he can make a lot of money at being a divorce lawyer after helping friend Frank Fay win a divorce action.

Wife Joan has seen her sister made so unhappy by divorce that she does not approve of her husband's method of earning a living by securing easy divorces for ladies. This situation eventually leads to an amusing and dramatic conclusion.

Aside from the deftly handled narrative, it must be noted that the dialogue is crisp and the situations involving Joan and Dick as a young married couple are a tribute to the acting ability of the pair.
