Contended Hour Salutes Service Corps; Richard Crooks Features "God Bless America" On Concert At 8:30 P. M. Monday

Defenders of America, past and present, will be saluted during the Contended Armistice Day program, Monday at 10:00 p. m., over WEA-F, Percy Faith conducting.

The program will open with "He's My Uncle." Following this the Navy will be honored with three salt water favorites, "Nancy Lee," "Sailor's Hornpipe," with the male chorus, and "Anchors Aweigh."

The male chorus also will be heard in the "Marine Hymn" and "Air Corps March," first official song of the Army Air Corps.

BAPTIST GROUPS MAPPING DINNER MEETING PLANS

WIDE LATITUDE OF POWER GIVEN DRAFT BOARDS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11—(AP)—C. A. Dykstra, director of selective service, said today that government workers should be given the same consideration with regard to occupational deferment from military training as was given private employees.

Group exemptions of local public employees, he said in a statement, are forbidden by law, but individuals may be granted deferment of training.

"For example," he said, "take the case of firemen—fear has been expressed that the act might operate so as to deprive a city of the services of an experienced fire chief thus impairing the safety of the community. This is clearly covered by provisions of the act and the regulations which provide that a local board may defer any man who is found to be a necessary man in his job where the job is in an activity productive or useful, and contributes to the well-being of the community or the nation."

Other signers of today's statement included the Rev. Charles Spence of Cincinnati.

17,195 PLACED ON OHIO JOBS

21 Per Cent Increase Reported By Public Employment Services

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11—(AP)—The Social Security board reported today that public employment services in Ohio placed 17,195 workers in private jobs last September, an increase of 21.7 per cent over the previous month.

Throughout the nation such agencies found jobs in private industry for 305,000 workers in September, the report said, an increase of 8.9 per cent over the previous month.

"Seasonal increases in employment and, to some extent, expanding activity in defense and related industries contributed to the higher number of placements," the board added.

In addition to the private placements, the agencies established a new record of 278,000 "supplemental placements" in September, mostly agricultural, reflecting the peak demand for workers in harvesting operations. Supplemental placements are those in which the unemployment office performs some but not all of the steps necessary to bring the worker and employer together.

In Ohio there were 579 during September. As employment increased to an estimated 500,000 during September, the number of men and women seeking jobs thru public agencies declined 5.7 per cent thru the country, to 4,900,000. In Ohio they dropped 2.3 per cent to 363,428.

The number of workers receiving unemployment insurance benefits likewise declined, the report continued, the drop amounting to 29 per cent. Total September payments were \$26,600,000, the lowest since December, 1939. In Ohio such payments totaled \$1,503,015 during September, a decrease of 28.8 per cent from the previous month.

FISH AND GAME DISTRICT BODY TO MEET DEC. 7

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, Nov. 11—Suggestions for 1941 fishing laws and regulations from the farmer-sportsmen committee of District No. 1 of the state division of conservation and wildlife will be compiled when the group meets in Ottawa on Dec. 7.

J. P. Warren, chairman of the district group, announced here today that each of the 13 county committees in the districts having its members answer questionnaires on the regulations. These will be summarized for consideration by the district committee.

Putnam's committee has signed about 70 of these papers for the district body's consideration. Warren stated, the suggestions of the various district groups in the state will be passed on in the state farmer-sportsmen committee which will draw up the final group of proposals for submission to the state conservation commission.
