GROCERY CHAINS WIN VERDICT IN SALES TAX CASE

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 21.—(AP)—The supreme court again has decided in favor of two grocery chains in litigation to compel them to pay almost \$1,000,000 additional in state sales taxes.

Motions striking the second amended petition of Hugh M. Foster of Columbus from the records were sustained yesterday. Early last spring the tribunal took similar action in Foster's first petition.

Foster sought to compel the state tax commission to collect \$500,645 from the Kroger Grocery and Baking Co. and \$102,648 from the Great Atlantic and Pacific Co.
