French Women Freeze Nazi Soldiers to Death

NEW YORK-Frenchwomen in German - occupied France treat Nazi troops so coldly that the morale of the troops has been shattered and some have committed suicide, two American woen who spent a month in Germanoccupied France asserted Satur-

The women, Marion Dix, South Pasadena, Calif., and her companion, Mary Anna Barker, Birmingham, Ala., arrived Friday from Bilboa, Spain, on the Spanish line vessel Marquess de Comillas. "The French women," said Miss Barker, "look right through the Nazi soldiers and the men can't stand it."

"The Frenchwomen have been magnificient," said Miss Dix. "They won't talk to German officers and soldiers. Even the women of the streets are patriotic. They ignore the soldiers, too, and the soldiers just don't understand it. The soldiers say they were told they were saving France from the English."

The two women spent a month at St. Jean de Luz in occupied France and asserted that an average of two German soldiers a day committed suicide there. Most of the troops were weary from the hard campaigns in Poland and France and were lonely for their
