### Westby Is Prep Cage Favorite

Westby high school, defending champion, has been installed as the favorite in the 1940-41 Monroe-Vernon County League basketball race which opens Dec. 6.

Four letterman from last year's team that won 10 straight conference games give Coach Willard Wandschneider the nucleus for another strong Westby team. The vets are Don Mockrod, Harry Jacobson, Tom Ballsrud, and Ralph Jacobson. Fifteen other candidates are reporting for the Westby team which opens its season tonight at Viroqua.

Normark and Cashton, which finished third and fourth, respectively, in the 1939-40 race, are expected to give Westby its stiffest competition. Coach D. R. Pawlisch has seven lettermen back at Normark. They are Cotton Kroeger, Jim Udulutch, Ray Westberg, Ray Haas, Jim Menn, Stanley Hefterman, and Don Karis.

At Cashton, Coach Bernard Derr, an Oshkosh Teachers college graduate, has four lettermen on his team that has won three of its four pre-league games. The lettermen are Maurice Person, Harvey Jermander, Don Peterson, and Jerome Jundt.

Kenneth Buckholtz and Keith Cox are the only lettermen back at Ontario and Coach Milo Lampher's team is not expected to repeat as runnerup. Phillip Maske, Hugh Rice, and Harvey Frews are the lettermen around whom Coach I. H. Hoff at Wilton must build his team.

Kendall is the sixth school in the conference. Opening league games Dec. 6 will have Cashton at Normark, Ontario at Westby, and Kendall at Wilton.
