TAXATION RATES ARE APPROVED IN VAN WERT-CO

(Special To The Lima News) VAN WERT, Nov. 28—Approval of the rates of taxation on real estate and tangible property for 1940 by the Ohio State Tax commission was announced today by County Treasurer G. M. Brown and auditor Harry D. Bellis.

Duplicates based on the new rates are being prepared and it is expected that the collection will be started during the latter part of the ensuing month.

The new rates show increases in eight tax districts, a decrease in 11, and rates were unchanged in 11 districts. The county's share has been set at 2.50 mills, among the lowest in the state.

It is noted that while eight districts have been increased the increases resulted from special levies sanctioned by voters at the general election in six districts. The highest rate in the county is Middle Point corporation, with 20.60 mills, which is an increase of \$2.70.
