2 p. m., WMAL—Two-part and three-part forms are discussed by Dr. Damrosch on the first half of his Music Appreciation Hour. The second half-hour features Haydn's Symphony No. 85 in B flat major, "The Queen of France."

The awards will be announced in the Nation-wide poster-drawing contest sponsored by the committee.
