### Pork Chops Drop 8.5 Per Cent

## Food Prices Decline Again

WASHINGTON—(U.P.)—Here's good news for American housewives—retail food prices have declined for the second consecutive month. The labor department announced this week that while the drop was but 3 per cent from Oct. 15 to Nov. 15, it followed a reduction of one per cent in the preceding month. Pork chops were 8.5 per cent cheaper than a month ago, oranges dropped 5.3 per cent, roasting chickens 2.3, round steak 1.6, and coffee .5 per cent. Staples such as sugar rose .1 per cent, potatoes 4, fresh milk 8, butter 3, and eggs 4.1. The department said costs of fruits and vegetables declined 1.2 per cent in the month and nearly all meats were lower in price except salt pork. Retail food prices declined 2.1 per cent at Jacksonville, Fla., 1.8 per cent at New Orleans; 1.7 per cent at Washington, and 1.6 per cent at Atlanta. Food prices increased 1.1 per cent at Kansas City; 1.5 per cent at St. Paul, and 1.3 per cent at Los Angeles.

## Football 'Draft' Hurts Labor, Millikan Says

HOLLYWOOD — (U.P.) — The ranks of boiler makers are being depleted by universities which "forcibly" register athletic students because of their football ability, Dr. Robert A. Millikan, Nobel prize winner and president of the California Institute of Technology, declared here. Dr. Millikan attached the system under which universities recruit athletes in an address to Phi Beta Kappa chapters on the 164th anniversary of the honor society. He spoke over a National Broadcasting co. Blue network which carried his speech to 90,000 Phi Beta Kappas observing the founding of the society at William and Mary college Dec. 5, 1776.

"A good football candidate," the scientist said, "is likely to be urged, or even more effectively persuaded, to give up his preference for the life of a boiler maker, and is forcibly registered in a university, as one of them recently reported, 'in a course in ethics, he got'."

Dr. Millikan also laid part of the blame for the failure of universities to properly select their students upon "a perverted social system which has made a degree, no matter how obtained, a matter of social distinction."

"If the American way of life is to survive in competition with the totalitarian way," he said, "the biggest job of our higher educational system is to succeed better in the two processes . . . of selection and of training our youth, to get into the leadership of our developing American civilization the best brains, the most able and competent men the country produces."

Steering students away from an attempt to enter that higher educational system when they do not show any capacity for solving analytical problems with success is not only the most humane procedure possible, but it is also one of the highest forms of civic duty, since the success of our democracy depends upon it," he said.

## BARCLAY ON BRIDGE

IT IS NOT LOST TIME  
A peculiar thing about the fastest players is that they usually take more time to plan a hand before playing a single card to the first trick. With their plan made up, they can usually race through the rest of the hand and thus more than make up the time they seem to have lost at the beginning. Furthermore, they make a bigger percentage of their contracts, through starting out with a sound idea in their mind.

playing the 2, East the K and South the 8—without having stopped to size up his problem. Little did he realize at the moment that this was the crucial mistake which beat his contract. East followed with the spade A and the 5, which South won. He then, striving to manufacture entries to the dummy too late, led the heart Q to the A, so he could start the diamonds with the K. East let that go, but took the next diamond as well as his two high hearts and his thirteenth in the suit, and later he took the club K, setting the contract three tricks.

If South had counted, he would have seen he had to bring in the diamonds, and needed two entries to dummy to do it. A second one could have been developed by merely playing a spade honor under the K and another under the A. This would have left him the 8 to lead to dummy's 10. Diamonds could then have knocked out East's A, and the heart A would have been the other entry to run the rest of the diamond suit and make the contract.
