The brave fight of Greece against the Italians who dared to invade the country was a surprise to the outside world. Although helped to some extent by Great Britain, it was the Greeks themselves who did most of the work of driving Mussolini's soldiers out of the country and into Albania.

Such an event may take our minds back to ancient times, when Greece was the world's leading nation. It was the leader not so much in war as in the arts of peace, but there were times when the Greeks did extremely well in defending their country.

Greek thinkers and writers were the greatest of their day. Statues made by ancient Greek sculptors are among the best ever produced, before or since. Their famous match industry is operating at only 25 per cent of capacity. Cuba is shipping more fresh vegetables to the United States than a year ago. The government of Paraguay is trying to promote domestic cotton growing.

So it came about that 400 men, mostly Spartans, stayed at the pass of Thermopylae while the other Greeks escaped. All of the 400 were struck down by the Persians, but their bravery has shone through the pages of history.
