Although supposedly weakened by the absence of four regulars because of a disciplinary measure, La Crosse Logan high school's basketball team kept rolling along Friday night, defeating Viroqua, 45-30, for its third straight South Central conference victory.

Wisconsin Dells and Reedsburg were victors in other league hits Friday night. The Dells nipped Sparta, 20-18, in two overtime periods. Reedsburg scored 16 points in the second quarter to trim Richland Center, 28-13.

The State School for the Deaf of Delavan defeated Portage, 30-21, in a non-conference game. Tomah defeated Baraboo, 14-12, in a loop tussle Thursday night.

Logan trailed Viroqua's defending conference champions during the first seven minutes of play, then took command and was in charge the remainder of the game.

A free throw by Harold Weber gave Wisconsin Dells a 16-all tie with Sparta in the last minute of regular playing time. Both teams missed free throws in the first overtime period. Dan Doyle scored a field goal for the Dells to win the second overtime.

Lawsky counted a goal for Sparta to leave the teams deadlocked. With a half minute of play left Duane Council dropped in a field goal to win for the Dells.

## BARCLAY ON BRIDGE

### STEER THE NO TRUMP

IT IS almost a universal measure that the better the players the more they try to steer a No Trump contract into the correct hand, the one which is better protected against a lead of the most dangerous suit. Reduced to its simplest element, this usually means that a player with guarded kings or king-jacks in his risky suits should strive to be the declarer if the hand be played at No Trumps, whereas a player with aces should favor suit bids by himself in the hope that his partner will be declarer if No Trump gets called.

With his very bad hand, West decided to try to hit his partner's suit with the opening lead, which was the heart 9. It drew forth the K, Q and A. A few contracts can be made when your only stopper of a suit is knocked out at the start, and it was so with this one. South had to run twelve tricks at once or be set. When the clubs failed to break, he could get only ten. The instant he lost the lead then the defenders ripped off the last three tricks, setting him two.

Better bidding, after North's 2-Clubs, would have been a mere 2-Diamonds by South. A fine bidder, willing to take sound chances, would now bid 2-No Trumps in the North despite his heart doubt and, after South took that to 3-No Trumps North might gently try 4-Diamonds. With that encouragement, South should jump to at least 5-No Trumps, which North should take to 6-No Trumps.

Now try to beat that contract. With East leading, the declarer would have two stoppers in which ever major suit is chosen. After using the Q, he could afford to lose a club to set up a fourth trick in that suit, giving him twelve in all.
