STEER THE NO TRUMP IT IS almost a universal measure that the better the players the more they try to steer a No Trump contract into the correct hand, the one which is better pro-tected against a lead of the most dangerous suit. Reduced to its simplest element, this usually means that a player with guarded kings or king-jacks in his risky suits should strive to be the de-clarer if the hand be played at No Trumps, whereas a player with aces should favor suit bids by himself in the hope that his partner will be declarer if No Trump
