of the other hand. The non-working fingers of your bowling hand should be slightly spread to aid in carrying, delivering, and spinning the ball. The working thumb and fingers should be buried securely in the

holes, but make sure they can be released from the ball freely upon delivery. If you are throwing a hook, your thumb is released before the fingers. Practice will determine your natural grip.

Now take your position from 12 to 15 feet behind the foul line on the approach, facing the pins. squarely. You can use a four or five-step approach. A three-step approach is not recommended. In four-step approach, you step forward with the right foot. the five-step approach, the left


