BETTER BOWLING

This is the third of a series of articles on bowling fundamentals, prepared by Walter Ward of Cleveland, O., one of the country's topflight pinmen.

HOLDING BALL-STANCE If you want to be a good bowler, you must learn to bowl naturally. Pick your ball up with both hands, inserting your thumb and finger or fingers securely into the holes.

The non-working fingers of your bowling hand should be slightly spread to aid in carrying, delivering, and spinning the ball. The working thumb and fingers should be buried securely in the holes.



Addressing the pins...

When addressing the pins, your body is erect, with shoulders square with the pins. Your feet rest evenly on both feet. Your feet can be close together or slightly apart. The ball rests in the left hand (for right-handed bowlers) and should be held somewhere between the belt line and the shoulders.

The open part of the 'V' formed by the thumb and index finger points directly at the headpin. Put the ball in motion with a gentle, natural push-away forward, using little more than the momentum of the ball's weight. Do not lower the ball in jerks. Take things easy and be natural.
