FDR Returns for 'Report to Nation' on Defense Emergency at 8:30 Tonight

President Roosevelt will be back on the air tonight in a "fire side chat" broadcast at 8:30 when he delivers his "Report to the Nation," an address which deals with the present emergency in national defense.

The president will be heard from the White House through WIBA, WMAQ, WBBM, WENR, WCFL, and WTMJ in this area.
