

Farley Still Wants Yankees

NEW YORK-(U.P)-The New York Yankees' baseball empire still is for sale and Jim Farley is the No. 1 choice to buy it but a little matter of money is keeping them apart, a checkup of the interested parties by the United Press revealed Wednesday.

There is every reason to believe that a syndicate headed by Farley sooner or lated will acquire control of the Yankees for a sum between \$3,500,000 and \$4,000,000 but the transfer isn't likely to take place in teh immediate future.

Farley was to leave today for a South American tour. He is expected to be gone from two to three months on business. While he's away it is understood that Farley's attorney will have full power to act for him if the necessary capital is raised. 




