Mussolini Foe to Speak on Fall of France Here

An exiled and bitter opponent of Mussolini in Italy, Count Carlo Storza, will lecture on "The Political and Moral Causes of the French Collapse" in a public meeting at 4:30 p. m. Thursday at the Wisconsin Union theater.

Count Storza was Italian minister of foreign affairs when Mussolini took over the country's government. Exiled because of his opposition to the dictatorship, the count lived in Belgium and France until the German invasion, and then escaped to America with his family.
