But when George Abbott was casting an all-colored show, "Brown Sugar," Butterfly, whose acting name is Thelma, boldly applied for one of the roles and landed it. This led to the role of Jenny, the maid, in "Frother Rat," and another prominent part in "What a Life," the show she left so she could play the part of Prissy in "Gone with the Wind."

The cast for the film version of Margaret Mitchell's novel is headed by Vivien Leigh, as Scarlett O'Hara; Clark Gable, as Rhett Butler; Leslie Howard, as Ashley Wilkes; and Olivia de Havilland, as Melanie Wilkes. The picture was directed by Victor Fleming.

For her role as "Prissy," Butterfly has more than stage experience. While she was studying to be a nurse at the Lincoln Training School in the Bronx, she worked as a domestic. After giving up the idea of nursing, Butterfly found a job in a factory, and on the side served as a reporter for the Harlem Eagle. She always harbored the idea that she could act, so she took part in any

venture romance. Starred in the film are Victor Mature and Louise Platt, and in prominent supporting roles are such favorites as Leo Carrillo, Bruce Cabot, Vivienne Osborne, Robert Barrat and Miles Mander.

The slum-bang, rough-and-tumble fight between Victor Mature and Bruce Cabot in "Captain Caution" required two and one-half days to film. Both actors used to do a lot of amateur boxing, but they agreed that this so-called slum battle was the most strenuous in which they had ever engaged.

Lively cowboy musical rhythm, ho-mau romance, rousing comedy and two-fisted western action are the exciting elements of "Wagon Train," the co-feature. The thriller of the early west stars Tim Holt with his horse Duke, while Ray Whitley and his Musical Buckaroos take care of the melody department; Martha O'Driscoll makes a lovely leading lady for Tim; and Emmett Lynn and Ellen Lowe provide the laughs.

With Muni at his best, "Hudson's Bay" is thrilling, moving and contains all the elements which go to make well-rounded motion picture entertainment.
