CHAPLAIN HEARD BY KIWANIANS; 9 PRESENTED PINS

An address by Rev. K. E. Wall, chaplain at Ohio State penitentiary, and presentation of attendance pins to nine members were highlights of the Kiwanis club meeting Tuesday at the Argonne hotel.

Talking on "Crime," the prison chaplain told clubmen, "Crime is our biggest business and greatest problem. For too many years we have been attacking it from the wrong end."

"Crime prevention should start in the home and from childhood, for the home is the predominant factor in the formation of character."

The speaker voiced a scathing denunciation of "reform schools" and characterized them as "crime schools." He said that 50 per cent of those incarcerated in penitentiaries received their "course" in crime in reform schools.

'The Ramparts We Watch' To Open At The State Thursday

Story Tells Of The Life Of An American Family During Hectic Days Of Before, During And After World War

The unique film, "The Ramparts We Watch," a film based on the American family before, during and after the World war, will be offered State theatre patrons commencing Thursday.

Adventurous entertainment at its best is offered in Paul Muni's latest starring film, "Hudson's Bay," currently holding the spotlight at the Quilna theatre.

Muni scores solid hit with an effective portrayal of Pierre Radisson, the renegade who moulded an empire. Gene Tierney, Laird Creger and John Sutton are featured.

Thrills are plentiful in the Ohio's "Gone With the Wind," but the stirring love scenes between Scarlett O'Hara and Rhett Butler, as played by Vivien Leigh and Clark Gable, will remain longer in the memory of filmgoers.

Currently showing at the Lyric is "Chad Hanna," a story of circus life filmed in technicolor. Starring in this production are Henry Fonda, Dorothy Lamour and Linda Darnell.

It was necessary to retain four cashiers with the company to pay off within 30 minutes after discharge each day. The story revolves around the romance and adventure in the lives of Victor Mature, portraying the title role, and Louise Platt, playing a high spirited girl, who takes her father's place as captain of the Olive Branch when he is killed in a sea battle.

As Corunna, a dauntless seafarer, Miss Platt is seen in her first starring role, a role which is intensely dramatic and gives her a fine opportunity to display her outstanding talents as a first rate thespian.
