Assisting in this feud of the age, either to egg them on or keep them apart, are Mary Martin, Verree Teasdale, the Merry Maes, Virginia Dale and Rochester.

## STATIC BLAMED FOR CRASH OF AIR TRANSPORT

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10 — (AP) — Malfunctioning of the Salt Lake City radio range, the Civil Aeronautics board reported today, was the probable cause of the crash of a United Airliner near Salt Lake City on Nov. 4.

Ten persons—seven passengers and three crew members—were killed. The airliner, bound to Salt Lake City from Oakland, Calif., crashed about 4 1/2 a. m. some 32 miles northeast of Salt Lake City in the Wasatch range.

While the plane operated in the vicinity of Salt Lake City, the board said, two-way radio communication between United's ground station and the pilots (Fay and first officer Thomas E. Sandgren) was made impossible for substantial periods due to severe static, which also interfered at times with reception of radio range signals by the pilots.

### Alec Templeton To Be Featured During Broadcast; Two Popular Strauss Melodies Will Be Heard

A riotous "It's-Our-First-Anniversary, Gadzooks!" celebration, featuring the return appearance of "Prof. Alessandro" (long-haired for Alec) Templeton, will mark the "Chamber of Music Society of Lower Basin Street" rhythm riot Monday at 9:35 p. m.

Two works by Johann Strauss will feature the concert Monday, over the NRC-Red Network at 8:30 p. m. EST. The first, "Southern Roses Waltz," will be played by the Symphony orchestra under the direction of Alfred Wallenstein. The second, "Voice of Spring," will feature Margaret Sparks, soprano soloist.

## CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTORS FIND TASKS ABROAD

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Feb. 10 — (AP) — Three young American conscientious objectors to military service now are working at civilian rehabilitation under wartime conditions in England and others are to follow them, a federal official disclosed here today.

Dr. Thomas E. Jones, national director of Civilian Public Service (CPS) said in an interview the three went abroad of their own volition because they "wanted to be in the thick of it all where they could lend a hand in serving needs." He added that six of their fellows would join them soon. He declined to give the names of any of the men.

Dr. Jones, on leave as president of Fisk university, said he expected 13,000 to 15,000 men to come under the supervision of CPS, which is working in co-operation with the selective service director to find civilian defense assignments for those who object to military service on conscientious grounds.
