

# Outstanding Cast Featured In Quilna's "Western Union"

### Dean Jagger, Randolph Scott And Robert Young Have Leading Roles In Saga Of The West

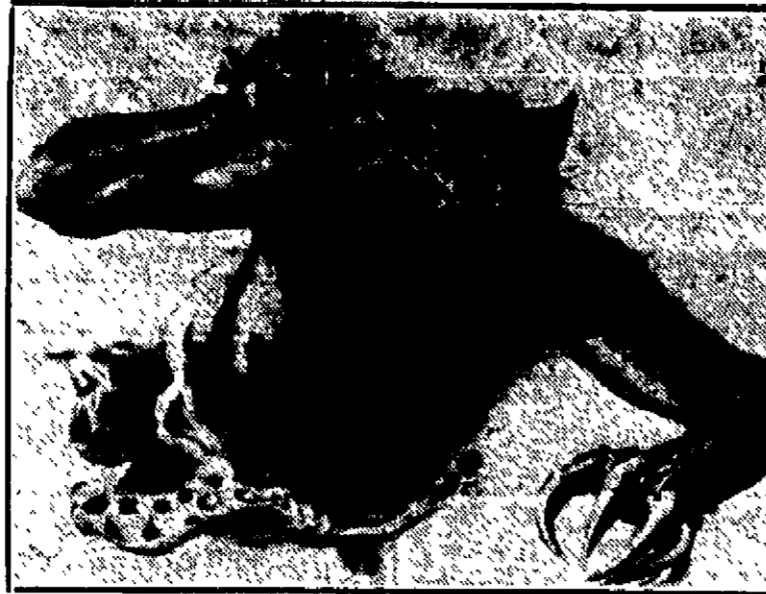

## DRAINAGE WORK IN HARRISON TWP IS COMPLETED

VAN WERT, Feb. 14—A highway drainage project in Harrison township has been completed by WPA workers. The project included the laying of 30,042 feet of highway drain tile and construction of 39 catch basins.

The total cost was \$12,109, of which \$9,139 was furnished by federal funds and \$2,763 by the township sponsor. Eighty-five men who were employed in the work were transferred Thursday for laying 16,000 feet of drain tile on the Middle Point-Wesley in Washington and Jackson tps.

Work on the latter project will be suspended for the time being when the sanitary sewer project is opened in Van Wert. WPA workers on state highways will be moved into the city for the project and it is expected that 165 men will be on the job by Feb. 24.

## EX-SPY'S DEATH CALLED SUICIDE AT WASHINGTON

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14—(UP)—The death of Gen. Walter G. Krivitsky, former Russian military spy, will be recorded on police records as a suicide today but the way will be left open for consideration of possible further evidence in the case.

Coroner A. Magruder MacDonald and inspector Ernest W. Thompson, chief of metropolitan police detectives, agreed last night to issue a certificate of suicide today but said a coroner's jury would be impelled to hear any other evidence that may "crop up."

## Continental To Seek Aid For School Project

(Lima News Bureau)  
OTTAWA, Feb. 14—Another school improvement is being planned in Putnam Co., County Supt. today.

The Continental rural board of education has applied for National Youth Administration aid in construction of a \$10,000 annex to its present auditorium-gymnasium.

This annex would be used for a farm shop, one classroom and a music room. It will be located adjacent to the east side of the gymnasium of approved, Vermilya stated.
