There are also exempt from tax amounts received by gift, bequest, devise, or inheritance; interest on obligations of the District of Columbia, any municipality, or other political subdivision of the State; interest on certain bonds issued by the United States Government or its possessions, and on Federal farm-loan bonds.

Amounts received through accident or health insurance or under workmen's compensation acts for personal injury or sickness, and damages received on account of such injuries or sickness also are exempt.

Pensions and compensation received by veterans from the United States for services in time of war are exempt; and pensions received from the United States by the family of a veteran for services rendered by the veteran in time of war are exempt.

There is also exempt from the federal income tax the rental value of a dwelling house and appurtenances thereof furnished to a minister of the gospel as part of his compensation.

Other items excluded from gross income are alimony and an allowance based on a separation agreement.

For That Income Tax Headache:

EDITOR'S NOTE—Following is another of a series of 31 articles on "Your Federal Income Tax," written by or based upon material received from the United States Bureau of Internal Revenue.

ITEMS EXEMPT FROM TAX

Certain items are specifically exempt from the income tax and need not be included in the taxpayer's return of gross income. Among such items are the proceeds from life insurance policies paid by reason of the death of the insured. Amounts received (other than annuities) paid by reason of the death of the insured and interest payments on such amounts and other than amounts received as annuities) under a life insurance or endowment contract, which are less than or exactly equal to the premiums or consideration paid therefor, are exempt from Federal income tax. Any excess received over the consideration paid is taxable.

Amounts received as an annuity under an annuity or endowment contract shall be included in gross income; except that each year the excess of the amount received over 3 percent of the aggregate premiums or consideration paid for the annuity is tax-free until

Every single person having a gross income of \$100 or more; every married person, not living with husband or wife, having a gross income of \$100 or more; and every married person living with husband or wife, having a gross income of \$2,000 or more.

WHEN MUST RETURNS BE FILED?
For the calendar year, on or before March 15. For the fiscal year, on or before the 15th day of the third month following the close of the fiscal year.

HOW DOES ONE MAKE OUT THIS INCOME TAX RETURN?
By following the detailed instructions given on Forms 100-A and 100, the income tax blanks.

WHAT IS THE TAX RATE?
A normal tax of 4 percent on the net amount of the income, arrived at by deducting legal exemptions and credits from the gross income; in excess of \$4,000; and a defense tax of 10 percent of the combined normal tax and surtax.

The aggregate of such sums excluded from gross income for the taxable year 1940 and prior years equals the aggregate premiums or consideration paid for the annuity.

There are also exempt from tax amounts received by gift, bequest, devise, or inheritance; interest on obligations of the District of Columbia, any municipality, or other political subdivision of the State; interest on certain bonds issued by the United States Government or its possessions, and on Federal farm-loan bonds.

Amounts received through accident or health insurance or under workmen's compensation acts for personal injury or sickness, and damages received on account of such injuries or sickness also are exempt.

Pensions and compensation received by veterans from the United States for services in time of war are exempt; and pensions received from the United States by the family of a veteran for services rendered by the veteran in time of war are exempt.

There is also exempt from the federal income tax the rental value of a dwelling house and appurtenances thereof furnished to a minister of the gospel as part of his compensation.

Other items excluded from gross income are alimony and an allowance based on a separation agreement.
