One of the most violent objectors to America's entrance in the World War I will be heard tonight at 8 through WENR and WIBA, when Sen. George W. Norris (Ind., Neb.) takes to the air on "The Lend-Lease Bill" to explain his views on American aid to Britain and her allies.

The Turnverein won each of the three round titles and thereby is grand champion. The team lost only two games in 45 starts during the season.

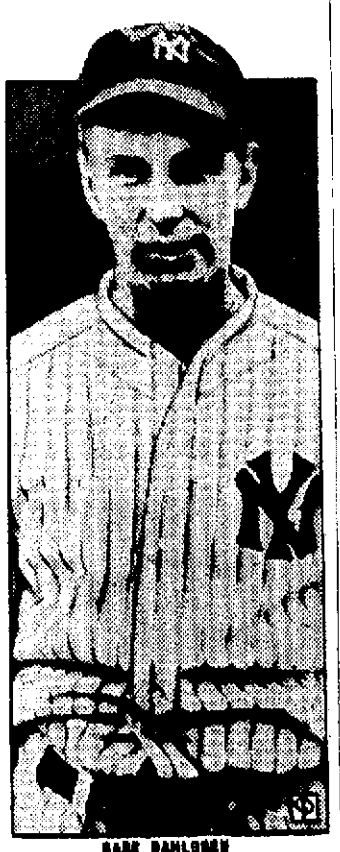
St. Petersburg Open Begins 36-Hole Play

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla.—(U.P.)—The New York Yankees announced the outright sale of First Baseman Babe Dahlgren to the Boston Bees of the National League for an undisclosed sum. Dahlgren, currently unsigned, was scheduled to be replaced this season by Johnny Sturm, who hit .312 with Kansas City in the American Association last year.

Dahlgren is a veteran of six years in the major leagues, two with the Boston Red Sox and the last four with the Yankees. He batted .264 with the Yankees in 1940 but has a major league average of only .253.

City Real Estate, Personal Property Tax Due Friday

Friday is the last day on which real estate and personal property taxes can be paid without penalty. City Treasurer D. John Leigh announced today.

If the real estate taxes are not paid until after March 22 before they can remit, Leigh must turn the delinquent roll over to the county treasurer not later than March 22. Personal property taxes can be paid in the city treasurer's office after Friday but a penalty of 2 per cent will be added.

On delinquent real estate taxes the penalty will be eight-tenths of 1 per cent per month, beginning last Jan. 1. All property owners who elected to pay real estate taxes on the July 31 extension plan must remit their February installment not later than Friday.
