Oscar Presentations, President's Talk to Be Broadcast Tonight

"Little Oscar" and President Roosevelt will highlight the airwaves tonight at 10:45 through WIBA, WGN, WBBM, and WMAQ in connection with the annual awards of the Motion Picture Academy of Arts and Science. NEW GLARUS—Brodhead stole the show in the opening games of the New Glarus district high school basketball tournament Wednesday night as it rode to a convincing 31-23 win over Blanchardville to assume the role of tournament favorite.

Albany eliminated Belleville, 17-13, in the other game played on the opening slate Wednesday night. Monticello, State Line League champion, goes into action tonight; it is favored to meet Brodhead in the finals Saturday night.

Albany, coached by Bill Kahl, outclassed Belleville in the second half to win. The losers scored only a single field goal in the second half, that coming on a shot by Maroy Dietsch in the fourth period. A 10-point drive in the second quarter gave Belleville an 11-9 lead at the half, but Albany took command in the third quarter.

Moses Laughridge, who gave Albany the lead at the start of the game, was the leading scorer with seven points.

Brodhead displayed too much class for Blanchardville. The Rock Valley League team grabbed a 7-0 lead in the initial period, then led at the half, 12-5.
