St. Mary's Is Giant Killer on First Day KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UP)—St. Mary's college of Winona, Minn., unseeded and almost uninvited to the national intercollegiate basketball tournament, today was the tournament's first giant killer. St. Mary's knocked off the defending champion, Tarkio (Mo.) college Monday night, 38-23.

First round victories were won by teams from Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Texas, and North Carolina. Eight games today and tonight will complete the first round and halve the starting field of 32 teams.

St. Mary's finished in second place in its Minnesota conference and only got into the tournament because the winner waived its right to enter. The starting team played the entire game, putting up a defense that Tarkio could not puncture.

Offensively, Monday's standout was Texas Wesleyan's Fort Worth, a "run-shoot-put" quartet which turned in a 71-62 victory over Evansville (Ind.) college.

Paced by Jack Thornton, a fast guard, the Texans paid complete attention to their opponents' goal, and almost none to their own. Evansville shot at will, but missed enough baskets to win half a dozen games. Evansville's Wilford Doerner was the day's high scorer, with 27 points, despite the defeat.
