'Black Rust,' Story of Wheat Blight, Tops Air Programs Tonight

"Black Rust," the deadly blight that swept across the wheat fields of the prairie states during the '90's was finally trapped in the steppes of Russia, will be presented on the Cavalcade of America program tonight at 6:30 through WMAQ. The story centers around Mark Carleton, who traced the plague from a cupboard of a Mennonite church, through the dusty archives of Washington, and in a Russian droschky.

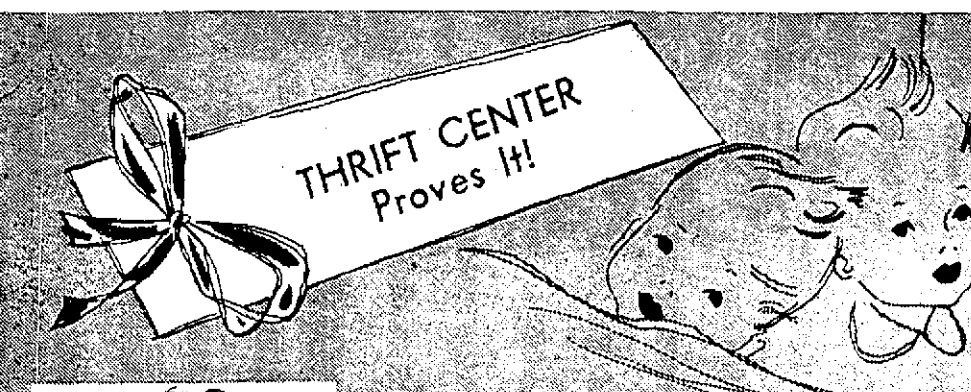
