PRAIRIE DU CHIEN—Crawford county Tuesday voted for Chester A. Fowler for the supreme court, 1,183-774 over Alvin C. Reis, and for John Callahan for state superintendent of public instruction, to whom they gave 1,054 votes compared with 628 for Edgar J. Doudna and 462 for Howard J. Williams.

Lenore M. Seldmann was unopposed for county superintendent of schools, and voters favored, 3,378-667, the referendum to allow installment payment of real estate taxes.
