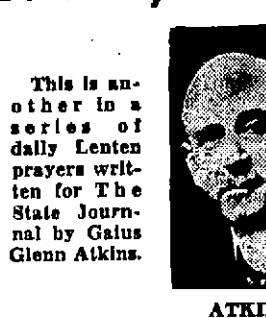
**Ridgeway Elects Strutt President**

**The End of Tears**  
"And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes..." Read Revelation 7:15-17.  
A tear is only a salty drop of water meant, if needed, to wash our eyes of dust, but tears are the timeless symbol of human pain and sorrow. Courage has always

accepted them, love consecrated them and faith has always seen a tearless order through their mists. The end of tears, the Buddhist says, is in ceasing to desire. The victory over tears, the Christian knows, is the compensations and healings of his faith.  
No need to adjourn all this to eternity. A mother's tenderness wipes away her child's tears, a friend's sympathy stays the tears of the stricken, a physician's skill dries the tears of pain. Someday Christian statesmen will end war's tears. Meanwhile as long as there are love and loss and hurt and tremulous happiness in this world, there will always be tears. **Oral Examination for PSC Post Set Next Week**  
Oral examination of 44 candidates for the civil service position of secretary of the Wisconsin public service commission will be held here next Thursday and Friday. J. Opstadal, acting state director of personnel, announced today. Sixty candidates took the written phase of the examination for the \$4,000-a-year post, but 16 of them failed and were ruled ineligible for the oral test, Opstadal explained.  
A final certification of the three top candidates for the job should be available for the public service commission April 14. Alvin H. Olson has been acting secretary of the commission since resignation of John Kaiser, Ripon, last fall.
