Democracy's Road Is Threatened Grass Declares Circuit Judge Henry Grass, Green Bay, known for his rehabilitation of delinquent children, stressed the need for greater American patriotism at the annual Kiwanis-Dane county rural federation banquet Tuesday night in the First Congregational church.

'Nobody knows the road ahead,' said Judge Grass, 'and the fires of discontent are burning everywhere. Our democracy is threatened both from within and from without, making it imperative that we safeguard all American interests and be loyal always to the United States.'
