ing of South's heart shortness from the opponents' strong bidding of the suit, his filler K in clubs, his shortness in diamonds and the location of the spade honors over the doubler. Plus, of course, his confidence in a fine partner. South proved the latter part of the case with much gusto. West led his club singleton, the A winning, and South fired back a spade, which West took with the A, East signaling with the heart 2, so West returned his heart 2 to the J. South ruffing. That launched a great cross-ruff, preceded by a lead to the spade 9, on which East shed a diamond. A heart was ruffed, the diamond A scored, a diamond was ruffed, another heart ruffed, another diamond, and then South led the spade K from dummy to the tenth trick. At that stage the dummy also held the heart K and the club K-5, and the declarer four clubs headed by the Q. East could not discard his heart A, which would have set up the dummy's K, so he cut down to the club J-9 by discarding the 8. Then the club K and Q dropped those two cards, the 6 making the last trick.

**Stoke Warns of Superficial Citizenship**  
More interest in government is no guarantee of good citizenship, for it may be expressed simply for possible personal gain, Prof. Harold W. Stoke, University of Wisconsin political science department, warned 500 students attending a Student Government week convention in the Wisconsin Union theater Friday.

"Too many good citizenship drives are disappointingly superficial," Prof. Stoke said, "because they harp on the lack of popular interest in government, instead of getting down to the heart of the matter. What is more important, is how those persons who do take an active part account for themselves. All too often, investigation shows greed for power and private advantage to be the basic incentive."
