Because out-of-state marriages of Wisconsin residents were not recorded, the state marriage statistics did not present the full picture, according to Francis E. Kester, assistant state registrar. Since 1913, when the state enacted its first antenuptial physicial examination legislation, out-of-state wed-dings have formed a considerable but unknwn percentage of Wisconsin's marriages.

Since 1917, when conscription for the first World war was in force and the state marriage rate was 15.5, the rate has been more than 15 marriages per 1,000 population only in 1920 (16.9), 1937




