Crawford County Wheat Allotments
PRAIRIE DU CHIEN—Allotments are now being determined for the 1942 wheat crop in Crawford county, John J. Kerrigan, chairman of the Crawford county agricultural assn., announced Wednesday.

"Any person desiring an allotment for a farm on which there was no wheat planted for harvest any one of the years 1939, 1940, and 1941, should submit a written request to the county for an allotment by June 1, 1941," Kerrigan said.

Prairie Sanitarium Seeks Return of \$1,306 Taxes

PRAIRIE DU CHIEN—Pres. O. E. Satter, of the Prairie du Chien Sanitarium co., announced Wednesday that Atty. J. S. Earl had filed a claim of \$1,306.20 against the city of Prairie du Chien for illegal taxation.

Plaintiffs claim the Prairie du Chien sanitarium is a charitable corporation, organized and existing under the laws of Wisconsin.

On March 3 the sanitarium company paid to the city treasurer, under protest, \$971.71 levied against them by the city for real property and \$334.49 for personal property for 1940. An attempt is being made to recover this amount.

The personal property of the Prairie du Chien sanitarium was assessed at \$10,430 and the real estate at \$30,300.

Milk Prices Up Cent in March in Chicago Area

CHICAGO—(U.P.)—A. W. Colebank, federal milk market administrator, Wednesday announced an increase of 1 cent per hundredweight over February prices for milk delivered in March by producers in the Chicago area.

Colebank said the blended price was \$1.74 per hundredweight, 3.5 per cent butterfat test. The price is 12 cents per hundredweight more than was paid in March, 1940.

Computation of the blended price is based on prices which handlers pay for their supplies in the four major classifications. During March, they were \$1.952 in class I, \$1.652 in class II, \$1.443 in class III, and \$1.263 in class IV.
