Toscanini to Conduct Tchaikowsky Concert as Season's Finale



Arturo Toscanini will end his fifth season with the NBC Symphony orchestra tonight, presenting an all-Tchaikowsky concert from the same platform which the composer conducted Carnegie hall's dedication concert 50 years ago.

Vladimir Horowitz, the conductor's son-in-law, will be piano soloist in the concert, which will be broadcast by WCFL at 8:35 and by WIBA beginning at 9:30.

Your chance to defeat the opponents' contract—if the hand offers any kind of a close question—usually depends upon your not overlooking a solitary beat along the way, but doing the right thing at the exactly right moment.

Much of bridge is like that—hinging on the time element which insists that some particular thing must be done at a particular time, not too soon, perhaps, or not too late.
