Ludwig Bahr and Herman Henze, plaintiffs in a foreclosure proceeding, were the only bidders. The church society and officers, who previously had challenged the mortgage and lost in the state supreme court which held that the mortgage had been properly authorized, were defendants.

Judge Morrison held that the 20 pews, church bell, organ, altar, carpet on the altar, the linoleum on the floor of the building, and a statutory image of Christ on the altar are fixtures and part of the real estate, and therefore covered by the mortgage.

He held the contrary to be true of about 25 chairs, a cabinet, desk, and loose tables in the basement. Citing cases of similar nature involving ordinary property, the judge said that it was relatively immaterial that practically all the property affected was installed subsequent to issuance of the mortgage in 1924 and held that most of the things were purchased and used as integral parts of the church while the chairs, desk, cabinet and tables are suitable for any purpose and not attached.

Concerning the statue of Christ, Judge Morrison said:

"Again I have some doubt as to the character of the statutory. However, it appears it was purchased as an adornment to become a permanent fixture of the church, to take its place along
