Hoppmann Grants Six Divorces

Circuit Judge A. C. Hoppmann Friday afternoon granted six divorces, four of them in Rockford, Ill., marriages. Stanley L. Whaley, 30, a cab driver, received a divorce from Helen Mary Whaley, 27, Monona, on grounds of cruel and inhuman treatment after he testified that she told him it was "none of your business" when she went out, that she did not care for him. He said he bought her a new car and that she became "drunk" and smashed it up, and that while she was in the hospital, numerous men called on her, but she told him to get out. They were married at Rockford, June 14, 1934. There are no children, and she may resume her maiden name of Oleson.

Ray Connelly, Madison telephone operator, won a divorce from Donald Connelly, on grounds of non-support. She said he had worked only about two weeks since their marriage April 4, 1938, in Dubuque, Ia., and that she had been the "meal ticket." There are no children, and she was permitted to resume her maiden name of Steele.

Evelyn A. Hewitt, Madison, who was 15 when she was married Dec. 31, 1936, in Rockford, was divorced from Ernest A. Hewitt, Sheboygan Falls, on grounds of non-support. She said he spent money on liquor, told her he consorted with other women, told her he did not love her, and abused her physically. She received custody of their one child.

Mrs. Dorothy Byrne, 707 Jennifer st., was granted a divorce from Thomas J. Byrne, 1845 E. Main st., a laundry presser, on grounds of cruel and inhuman treatment also. She testified that he drank to excess, struck her, called her names. She was permitted to resume her former married name of Hubbell.

Each home is of great importance and no community can rise above the level of its home," she asserted.

The key person in the home, usually the mother, has the job of making family life a satisfying and stimulating experience for everyone; teaching the family how to live together and to work together harmoniously, teaching her people how to meet success and failure, Miss Rude explained.

At Friday's session, Hortense White, Madison, circuit leader in family relationships for the state board of vocational and adult education, told the convention such relationships had a "real function" of educating persons to change undesirable emotional patterns into desirable ones.

Studies of family relationships, she claimed, can "build faith in the goodness of life, and a faith that with all this bloodshed the human heart is slowly but surely rising."

"The bully in the world situation is pitifully like the bully in our neighborhood or in our homes," she claimed, "to understand one helps understand the other."
