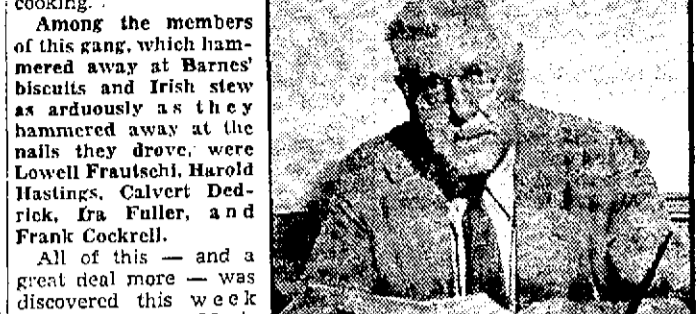

Volney Barnes Cooked for Camp High Priced Labor Built First Y Camp

You might think, to look at him, that Volney Barnes, principal of West High school, had been an educator all of his life but only twenty years ago, in the fall of 1921, he was working as a cook for a construction gang, and the construction gang was complaining bitterly about his cooking.

Assault Brings Three Year Term to Fond du Lac Man
FOND DU LAC (U.P.)—Harold Funk, 26, Fond du Lac, Saturday was under a suspended prison sentence of one to three years after pleading guilty in circuit court to assault with intent to do great bodily harm.

Funk admitted shooting his brother-in-law, Vernon Everling, last November. Judge C. F. Van Peit was advised that Everling had requested Dist. Atty. S. Richard Heath to drop the case. Funk originally was charged with assault with intent to murder.

The court said Funk would be required to pay costs of hospital treatment for Everling.

City's Debt Reaches \$4,451,000

The city of Madison owed a total gross debt of \$4,451,000 as of end of fiscal year June 30, 1940, the United States department of commerce reported Saturday in a study of state and local government debts.

Compared with Racine, having a population figure approximately the same, Madison's total debt then was \$1,064,000 higher than the lake shore city's, the study showed.

Madison's debt total consisted of \$5,199,000 in general long term obligations, payable from any revenues not otherwise obligated; \$150,000 in revenue bonds outstanding, payable exclusively from revenues of specified income-producing properties for which the bonds originally were issued; and \$102,000 covered by special assessments. All obligations were interest bearing.

Comparative figures for local and state government debts borne by each Wisconsin citizen showed a sharp drop between 1932 and 1940. In 1932, each person had \$70.09 in local debts charged against him, 40 cents for state debts, totaling \$70.49. For 1940, the figure had dropped to \$46.91, local debts, but rose to \$1.31 for the state, totaling only \$48.22, the report stated.

The state's total gross debt in 1932 was \$209,347,000 against only \$151,328,000 as of June 30, 1940.

Youth, Sleeping in Stolen Car, Shot as He Flees

MILWAUKEE (U.P.)—A young man identified by police as Matthew A. Tumidajewicz, 21, was shot and wounded Saturday by policeman Frank Rutkowski, who said he found him sleeping in a stolen automobile.

The officer said Tumidajewicz fled upon being roused and failed to heed a warning shot fired into the air. Attendants at an emergency hospital reported Tumidajewicz in "fairly good" condition Friday after removal of the bullet from just below his heart.

An attending physician said he had a chance to recover.

Police records showed that Tumidajewicz had served sentences in the Waukesha industrial school and the state reformatory in Green Bay for stealing cars. The officers said he told them he couldn't resist the temptation of taking an automobile and riding in it.

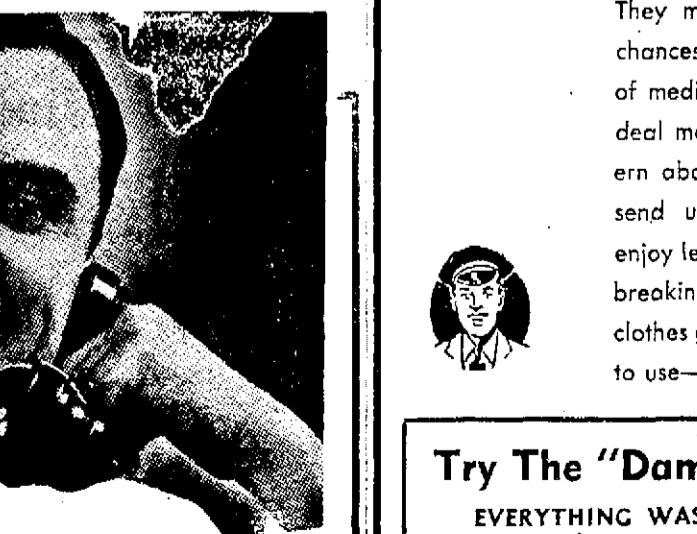
