Villages, and private agencies first quarter which included 23,281 tuberculin tests, of which 1,772 were positive. The positive reactors were examined further, and 73 active cases were diagnosed. Physicians directed taking 2,281 X-rays, and there were 391 admissions to sanatoria.
 "Techniques in tuberculosis case-finding are being improved steadily, and the nurses are keeping up in their part of the work," said Cornelia van Kooy, R. N., state supervisor of public health nursing.

Banquet Ends Rural Life Conference

The disappearance of unlimited economic opportunity and the gradual breakdown of a system of widespread land ownership among farmers were blamed for many of the weaknesses American democracy suffers today by Mrs. Raymond B. Sayre, president of the American Country Life assn. She spoke before 400 delegates to the ninth Wisconsin Rural Life conference at the First Congregational church Saturday night.
 The banquet concluded the conference, sponsored by the Blue Shield Country Life club and the University of Wisconsin rural sociology department. It was one of a series of state meetings to prepare Wisconsin delegates for the section meetings of the association, held at Nashville, Tenn., in November.

"Now that we belatedly have realized our natural resources are not inexhaustible, and are faced with a serious lack of economic opportunity for our youth," Mrs. Sayre said, "we must bend every effort toward adjusting our democracy so it can function effectively."
 Principal M. R. Goodell, Columbia County Normal school, told the delegates he believed "American democracy should strike a happy economic opportunity and the medium between idealistic government and dictatorship."

A series of panel and group discussions Saturday framed a list including the problems conference delegates considered the most pressing facing democracy today. Some were:
 ONE. A serious lack of economic democracy, making political democracy insecure.
 TWO. The problem of impressing clearly upon America the benefits and advantages of democracy.
 THREE. A distressing lack of economic security among the rural population.
