Two More Allis Strike Rioters Jailed

MILWAUKEE—(U.P.)—Defense Atty. Arthur W. Richter today prepared appeals from the two latest district court convictions in cases arising from rioting during the recent 76-day strike at the Allis-Chalmers co.'s West Allis plant.

District Judge Harvey L. Neelen late Friday sentenced Leslie Roth, 27, striking secretary of the steward Congress of Industrial Organizations United Automobile Workers local 248 and brother-in-law of local president Harold Christoffel, to four months in the Milwaukee county house of correction. Roth was charged with unlawful assembly and rioting.

Victor O'Connor, 32, was sentenced to 30 days in the house of correction for destruction of property. Execution of both sentences was stayed for 10 days pending appeal by Richter.

Roth and O'Connor were the last of eight defendants convicted of various charges in connection with the strike disorders. Execution was delayed in each case pending appeal to a higher court. The longest sentence imposed in all except Roth's case was 90 days.

Here's One 'If' Vote for Conn

NEW YORK—(U.P.)—I pick Billy Conn to defeat Joe Louis and become the new heavyweight champion of the world.

Reluctantly I make this forecast, because I realize I'm writing on dynamite as I type the words. And I wouldn't do it were it not for the fact that I am surrounded by a bevy of boozers who insist that a fight "explosive" is a coward if he doesn't go off the deep end with-out benefit of cork jackets.

This prediction is particularly dangerous because it involves two question-mark fighters. Moreover, the percentage is all against my selection if you believe the ancient adage that a good big man can lick a good little man, because Louis will have about 22 pounds more in the weights. He will outweigh Conn about 202 to 180.

There also is the adage, "string with the champion." But in this scrap we have two champions, because Conn was lightweightweight king before he gave up the crown. To be brutally frank, this is an "if" fight. Conn can't lose "if" he goes five rounds.

So—we're staking our reputation on the mentality of Conn and his handlers, believing that Pittsburgh Billy will make a different kind of a fight during these five rounds than in most of the previous opening quintets we have witnessed.

I pick Conn because he is the greatest natural fighter I've ever seen. As to because he's the smartest and speediest operator in any of today's divisions. Moreover, he has the stamina of two mules. He is a tough kid, up from Pittsburgh's streets, who never has been knocked out and who has been floored but twice—both times as a middleweight—by Oscar Rankins in 1937 and by Ray Actis in 1938. But he licked both of those guys, knocking out Actis in eight rounds.

Conn is young—a comer—improving every year. He is 23 whereas Louis is 27, the age when a fighter starts to slip. In Louis' last six fights he has given indications that he is slipping.

Perhaps I have been prejudiced against Louis. I never regarded the Detroit Negro as a super-fighter. I couldn't be-cause of his slow thinking under fire, his lack of footwork and his inability to take a punch. Unquestionably, much of the success of Mike Jacobs' great "meat ticket" was due to inferior opposition.

When Louis tackles young Conn a week from tonight, he will be facing his most feared combination—speed and craft. Louis is a "manufactured" fighter—a mechanical man who has been taught to do certain things. Even his trainer, Jack Blackburn, admits that.

When Bomber Joe was forced to think in the ring—in the first Schmeling, Paston, and Godoy scraps—also in the Tommy Farr brawl—he proved himself mighty low in the I. Q. When the Pitt whirlwind starts operating, Louis will be flustered completely, from the first left jab.

That left jab is important, if one is to take cognizance of Louis' fight with big Abe Simon at Detroit in March. Every time Simon pushed out that wagon tongue of
