

LONDON-(U.P)-The air ministry Saturday highly praised Amer-ican-built Tomahawk fighters and described how they were winning important air battles for Britain in North Africa and Syria.

In the first major test for the Tomahawks, built by the Curtiss-Wright Airplane co. and known in the United States as P-40's, 10 of them tore into 30 Messerschmitt 109's over the western desert Thursday, shot down at least four and damaged many more without loss to themselves, the ministry said.

A sergeant-pilot, who took part in the battle, was quoted as saynig:

"The Tomahawks behaved magnificently. It was a treat to see the way they ran through the Germans.

"The Messerschmitts went for us between Tobruk and Bardia. There was a terrific mix-up. I saw two of my pals shoot down one of them and I got mine by diving on him at full speed. The Tomahawks have all the speed you want."


